
## Living by the northern sea

The Moyoro Shell Mound at the mouth of the Abashiri River is the remains of a village where the Moyoro people lived approximately 1,300 years ago.

The Moyoro people, who migrated to the area from the north, had a unique lifestyle known as the Okhotsk culture.

It has been 100 years since the Moyoro Shell Mound was discovered, leading to the recognition of the Okhotsk culture.

- · Eating and smoking are prohibited in the museum.


